The UKRAINE Network

Research diaspora communities exist in many countries, and can play an important role both as peer support framework for their members and to channel knowledge, expertise and valuable professional contacts back to the countries of origin. Examples include the GAIN-Network of German scientists in North America, <http://www.gain-network.org>, which to a certain degree inspired our initiative, the Society of Spanish Researchers in the UK, <http://www.sruk.org.uk>, or an impressive in its reputation, size and worldwide spread the German Korean Alumni Network (ADeKo), which is now a roof organisation for 48 Societies around the world (<http://www.adeko.or.kr/deu>).

The motivation to establish the UKrainian Academic International Network (The UKRAINE Network) arose from two key considerations. First, it was the awareness that many of our countrymen are successfully integrated in the international scientific community, but at the same time the knowledge about them is patchy at best – both in Ukraine and abroad. And second, from the feeling that now is the right time to get together and support the nascent reforms in science and higher education system in Ukraine.

The UKRAINE Network is envisioned as a community of scientists and university professionals, who work both in academia and broader economy, in and outside of Ukraine, and who are interested in bi-lateral academic and scientific collaboration with Ukraine, as well as broader international cooperation. The main goals of the UKRAINE Network are:

- Fostering bilateral and international academic cooperation with Ukraine;
- Supporting the integration of Ukraine into the European Research Area;
- Supporting, the career development of early-career researchers through peer mentoring and targeted activities;
- Improving knowledge about Ukraine abroad, its university and research landscape, and vice versa;
- Establishing of a pool of international experts, who are interested to provide their knowledge and expertise (especially on peer reviewing and research funding) to support the reforms in science & higher education system in Ukraine.

This as yet non-formalised network already brought together dozens of interested scientists and science managers, both of Ukrainian origin and not, who are working in academia as well as in industrial R&D in Germany, but also in the UK, Israel, the Netherlands, etc. What do we plan to do? We anticipate that this network will be bottom-up-driven and structured through regional and thematic groups. Local **MeetUps/ Stammtische** can be useful for informal networking and peer support, whereas topic-focussed thematic groups (on various scientific topics, research funding, university administration, etc.) can coordinate and organise bi- and multi-lateral scientific events, summer schools, joint applications for research funding, etc. A dedicated **web-site**, regular **Newsletter** and an annual **Networking Forum** will provide ample opportunities for sharing information and best practice, coordination of activities, identification of partners and topics of mutual interest, as well as serve to increase the visibility of our community and contribute to improving knowledge about Ukraine, its academic landscape and innovation potential abroad, and vice versa. In order to support the UKRAINE Network's activities in Germany an initiative group is in the process of founding a Society (tent. name: **German-Ukrainian Academic Society**), more information to follow.

First Networking Event on GERMAN-UKRAINIAN ACADEMIC COOPERATION 28-29/01/2016, Berlin

This meeting was initiated by a group of Ukrainian-born German scientists and organised by the **DAAD**, **Alexander von Humboldt Foundation** and the **DFG**, with generous support from the Federal Ministries for Foreign Affairs and Education and Research. More than 200 participants – current DAAD and Humboldt fellowship-holders and alumni, scientists from Germany and Ukraine, who work on joint DFG-supported scientific projects and high-level officials both from German and Ukrainian ministries and research organisations, gathered in Berlin on 28-29 of January, 2016. This meeting for the first time offered an opportunity for current Ukrainian fellowship-holders to meet and network with already established researchers in Germany, as well as learn about funding schemes supporting bilateral scientific collaboration. At the panel discussion, workshops and throughout the meeting the participants have discussed some of the main challenges faced at the moment by the Ukrainian scientific community, the undergoing reforms, and elaborated on some potential solutions. The event was loaded with positive energy and genuine enthusiasm and now we aim to translate it into specific joint activities, which will make a difference!

COOPERATION HIGHLIGHTS

Longstanding cooperation between the National University of Chernivtsi and University of Applied Sciences Lübeck on restorations of historic city centres

Die Nationale Universität Chernivtsi (CHNU) und die Fachhochschule Lübeck (FHL) kooperieren seit 2011. Beide Hochschulen verbinden die Fragen der Altstadtsanierung in der Ausbildung von Architekten und Bauingenieuren. Das Deutsch-Ukrainische Hochschul-Praxis-Partnerschaftsprojekt „**Planen und Bauen für die historische Stadt**“ ergänzt die Ausbildung an beiden Standorten um eine praxisnahe und internationale Komponente. Das Projekt wird gemeinsam mit Partnerorganisationen aus der Bauwirtschaft durchgeführt und vom DAAD aus Mitteln des Bundesministeriums für wirtschaftliche Zusammenarbeit und Entwicklung gefördert (2013-2016). Jährlich finden zwei studentische Fächekursionen statt. Die gegenseitigen Besuche in der westlichen Ukraine und in Norddeutschland umfassen ein breites Programm, Symposien, Workshops u.v.m. Auch der Ausbau eines mehrsprachigen Online-Fachglossars für das Bauwesen (<http://baumedia.oncampus.de>) gehört zum Partnerschaftsprojekt.

Mit dem Ziel, die Zusammenarbeit mit der Ukraine weiter auszubauen, hat die FHL im Februar 2016 einen ERASMUS⁺ Projektantrag in "Capacity Building" eingereicht. Insgesamt 10 Hochschulen aus Deutschland, Litauen, Polen, Rumänien und der Ukraine haben sich zusammen gefunden, um die Lehrplanentwicklung an insgesamt sechs ukrainischen Hochschulen zu unterstützen. Das Projektvorhaben soll zur Europäisierung der ukrainischen Hochschulausbildung beitragen.
