COMMEMORATION

Oleh Hornykiewicz, world’s leading neuroscientist (1926-2020)

Ukraine-born Oleh Hornykiewicz passed away on 26 May 2020 aged 93. His greatest achievement and contribution to humanity was “*opening a new approach in the control of Parkinson’s disease by L-Dopa*”, as stated by the Wolf Foundation Prize Committee in Medicine in their decision to award the Prize in Medicine for 1979 to Roger W. Sperry, Oleh Hornykiewicz and Arvid Carlsson. Oleh Hornykiewicz was born in 1926 in Sykhiw (now a part of Lviv, Ukraine), which was then part of Poland. His family fled to the West in 1940 when the Soviet Army invaded. In 1951 he received his M.D. degree from the University of Vienna and joined the faculty of his alma mater the same year, where he worked ever since. He won a scholarship from the British Council with the intention to work with the German-born physician, biochemist and Nobel Laureate Sir Hans Krebs in Oxford. As Krebs had no appropriate project for him, he was recommended to Hugh (Hermann) Blaschko, a German émigré. Under his auspices, Hornykiewicz worked on the role of dopamine in peripheral tissues of guinea pigs.

Back to Vienna, Hornykiewicz decided to investigate dopamine in human brains. Together with his assistant Herbert Ehringer, he examined post-mortem brain material, 3–20 h after death, from 20 controls, 2 patients with Huntington’s chorea, 6 with other extrapyramidal diseases and 6 with Parkinson’s disease with a rather insensitive colorimetric method. In the basal ganglia of controls as well as in the Huntington cases, they found high concentrations of dopamine, whereas it was selectively diminished by a factor of approximately 10 in the Parkinsonian patients. In 2007, Hornykiewicz stated: ‘*For the first time, a specific chemical abnormality was found in a specific brain region in specific brain disorder...*’. Later, with a more sensitive spectrofluorometric method, Hornykiewicz demonstrated dopamine depletion in the *pars compacta* of *substantia nigra* and was determined to replace the missing dopamine in Parkinson’s disease patients by L-Dopa. A year later, he initiated the first clinical trials of medication to treat this disorder. **His development of L-Dopa for the treatment of Parkinson’s disease revolutionized treatment and**



remains the cornerstone of the therapy today. Thousands of patients worldwide have benefitted from his research and discoveries.

The fact that Hornykiewicz never received a Nobel Prize for his work was a cause of some outrage among scientists: more than 250 neuroscientists signed an open letter to the award committee in 2000. His observations stimulated the studies of Arvid Carlsson, Paul Greengard and Eric Kandel (all Nobel recipients in 2000) that mapped the signaling regulation pathways of the brain's most important functions.

Since the summer semester 2013, Prof. Khabyuk has been representing the field of business administration, in particular communication and multimedia, at the School of Business and Economics. Born in 1981, the Ukrainian graduated in business administration at the University of Cologne in 2004 with a degree in business administration, received his doctorate (Dr. rer. oec. pol.) at the Ukrainian Free University of Munich (UFU) in 2007 and habilitated there in 2012 with a thesis on "Media Economics as an Academic Discipline in Ukraine". During his professional activity at the Institute for Broadcasting Economics from 2006 to 2012, he worked on various expert opinions, among others, in connection with the introduction of the broadcasting fee in 2013. His research focuses on new media genres and their implications for business models, sustainability and marketing professions.

Artificial Intelligence Research Laboratories to be established at Ukrainian Universities - the First Stage started

Ukrainian universities will set up research laboratories in the field of artificial intelligence (AI) with the support from business sector. The first stage of this initiative – the presentation of the project of AI research laboratories for representatives of universities and IT business – took place on June 25, 2020. The event was organized jointly by the Committee for the AI Development in Ukraine under the Ministry of Digital Transformation and the Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine and was attended by more than 100 representatives of Ukrainian higher education institutions. One such project has already been implemented at the Ukrainian Catholic University (UCU) in cooperation with SoftServe: As part of this partnership, the Faculty of Applied Sciences of UCU will open a new training course – Deep Reinforcement Learning.

Interdisciplinary Analytical Center launched at the Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv

An Interdisciplinary Analytical Center has been established at the Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv to advance studies of the socio-economic well-being and mental health of Ukrainians. The Center is supported by a grant from the International Renaissance Foundation within the initiative "Institutional Development of University Analytical Centers". In total, more than 50 proposals were submitted to the competition, of which five won. Other four winners are: Kyiv University named after B. Hrinchenko, Center for Social and Humanitarian Aspects of



Regional Studies of Sumy State University, IGO "Kyiv Economic Institute" (Kyiv School of Economics) and Vasyl Stefanyk Precarpathian National University (Educational and Research Center for Sociological Research).

The International Renaissance Foundation has been implementing the Analytical Centers Initiative since 2014 in partnership with the Open Society Initiative for Europe (OSIFE) and with the financial support of the Swedish Embassy in Ukraine. The aim of the Initiative is to promote the development of public policy in Ukraine, improve the quality and practices of management decisions by increasing the role and level of trust in think tanks by strengthening their institutional capacity and implementing best practices of think tanks.

Female Leadership in Academic Management: A New Stage of KNEU-UKN Cooperation

The University of Konstanz (Germany) and the Kyiv National Economic University named after Vadym Hetman (KNEU, Ukraine) are proud of one of the longest bilateral cooperation histories between academic institutions from Ukraine and the Western part of Germany, which dates back to 1987. In 2018 a group of KNEU gender researchers and managers teamed up to promote equal opportunities in academia and established the “Gender Initiative for Universities and Society” (GENIUS). Within this initiative they arranged a number of successful international conferences, round tables, dedicated trainings, flash mobs etc. to draw attention to inequalities at the university and inform about equal opportunity policies implemented in the EU. In 2020 the University of Konstanz and KNEU/GENIUS started a 4-year capacity building project “Female Leadership in Academia and Management in Germany and Ukraine” (FLAMINGU), which is funded by the DAAD from the funds of the Federal Ministry of Economy, Cooperation and Development (BMZ) with the aim of strengthening women’s role in academic management at KNEU. This ambitious project will establish structures for equality, empower of female researchers and support gender equity at KNEU. Towards this goal, the Ukrainian partner aims to develop a basis for the implementation of the European standards in constructing the structures for equality (documents and processes), sensitizing the university's leadership, promoting female researchers for the leading positions and educating the management staff. The project will foster women’s leadership in academia, in particular through the development of academic mentoring and networking.

Swiss-Ukrainian Decentralization for Improved Democratic Education Project (DECIDE)

The Decentralization for Improved Democratic Education (DECIDE) aims at providing support to the state and local authorities in the establishment of effective, transparent and participatory systems of education management on regional, sub-regional and ATCs level in targeted regions. Decide project was designed to address the challenge of synchronizing and aligning the decentralization reform and the reform of education in Ukraine through strengthening the capacities and democratic governance of amalgamated territorial communities and creation of conducive environment for local authorities to implement sectoral decentralization with a focus on education. DECIDE is implemented in 16 communities of Ivano-Frankivsk, Luhansk, Poltava and Odessa regions. Its first phase will last from February 2020 to January 2025.

DECIDE project is implemented by the Consortium of the NGO DOCCU (Ukraine) and Zurich University of Teacher Education - PH Zurich (Switzerland) and is supported by the Swiss Confederation represented in Ukraine by the Embassy of Switzerland / Swiss Cooperation Office in Ukraine. The Consortium is also supported by the Association of ATCs as a strategic national implementation partner. This project builds on the achievements of the project Swiss-Ukrainian Development of Citizenship Competences in Ukraine Project (DOCCU) implemented by Zurich University of Teacher Education from 2013 to 2018.

U21 Ranking of National Higher Education Systems

The Universitas 21 Ranking is the only one in the world to assess national higher education systems, and meets a long-standing need to shift discussion from the ranking of the world's best universities, to the best overall systems in each country. This report presents the results for the ninth annual ranking of national systems of higher education undertaken under the auspices of the Universitas 21 (U21) group of universities. Fifty national systems of higher education, from all continents, are evaluated across 24 indicators. The measures are standardised for population size. Countries are ranked overall and on each of four modules: Resources, Environment, Connectivity and Output. Within each measure the highest achieving country is given a score of 100 and scores for other countries are expressed as a percentage of this highest score.

Ukraine reached the overall rank of 36 (2 positions improvement compared to 2019). When levels of GDP per capita are taken into account, Ukraine's overall ranking improves to 14th and its score is above that expected at its income level.
