

Research expenditure & organization









 - entitled to confer doctorates
 - strong in research
 - around 22,000 international collaborations
- 203 universities of applied sciences (FH/UAS):
 - combine practical science & application-oriented teaching
 - entitled to confer doctorates in certain subjects/ joint doctoral degrees
 - regionally rooted & cooperate with companies, associations, municipalities or social institutions at the local level

BMBF program Funding of the German-Ukrainian "Cores of Excellence (CoE) in Ukraine

With this programme the German Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF) is supporting the establishment of excellent joint German-Ukrainian research groups or small institutes (Cores of Excellence, CoE) in Ukraine to strengthen the sustainable bilateral research partnership between Germany and Ukraine.

A total of 38 eligible applications were submitted in 2019.

<u>12 concepts</u> were selected for the concept phase funding (aiming at the development of a detailed economically feasible plan), incl. with Berlin researchers:

<u>ReLoaD</u>: Interdisciplinary research on decentralization and its impact on the democratic process in Ukraine.

Coordinator: Institute for European Politics (IEP), Berlin, in cooperation with Kyiv School of Economics (KSE)

- ✓ Supports scientific cooperation between German & foreign researchers: approx. 1,000 scholars funded per year
- ✓ €131.4m
- Person-centred (from postdoc level)
- ✓ Philipp Schwartz Initiative for researchers at risk: The 12th call is expected to be announced in June 2022

German Research Foundation



- ✓ Biggest research funder: €3.3bn, > 30,000 funded projects per year
- ✓ Self-governing organisation for science and research funded at federal & state level
- ✓ Project-specific funding for postdocs; coordinated programmes; Excellence Strategy; infrastructural funding
 - ✓ Walter Benjamin position: refugee researchers who have been forced to leave their home country within the last 3 years could embark on their own research project
 - Under many DFG funding programmes it is possible to submit supplemental proposals for the purpose of integrating persons who have fled their home countries in ongoing DFG projects that already receive funding

Cooperation with Developing Countries



- ✓ Eligible to apply are researchers/scientists from all subjects and disciplines at German research institutions who have completed their academic education (typically by having completed a doctorate)
- ✓ Funding for personnel, scientific instrumentation and apparatus, consumables, travel, miscellaneous expenses and publications
- ✓ For both the partner institute in Germany and the cooperation partner/institute in the developing country
- ✓ No deadline






- ✓ A network of currently 49 non-university research institutes in Berlin

European Fund for displaced scientists

On 31 March, ALLEA launched a <u>new programme</u> to support scientists impacted by the war. The initiative is funded thanks to the Breakthrough Prize Foundation donation of \$1.5 Million.

Funding Line 1 provides funds to academic institutions in Europe that are willing and able to host researchers who have been displaced by the war in Ukraine. The aim is to provide immediate assistance to scholars in the continuation of their research in a safe environment.

- ➤ Eligible are include postdoctoral & senior researchers, as well as assistant, associate or full professors affiliated with Ukrainian academic and/or research-performing institutions
- ➤ Applications will be received in 2 rounds: (1) 1 July 2022 and (2) Information about the 2nd round will be provided in due course

Funding Line 2 provides funds to affected Ukrainian universities, academies, and research institutes to help them maintain and/or reinstate their scientific operations and research collaborations. Its aim is also to support the reintegration process of researchers upon their return to Ukraine. The call will be launched in the near future.


